



The settlement of Combs straddles the National Park and is located within the parish of Chapel-en-le-Frith, just over 1 mile southwest of Chapel-en-le-Frith and 3 miles north of Buxton. It was originally two settlements; Rye Flatt and Pritchard Green, which have now come together as Combs. The historic reference to these two settlements is still apparent in the form of an area of green space.

Combs Village Hall Trust (CVHT) lease the village hall and chapel to Combs primary school during the day in term time. Outside of school hours the hall and chapel are used by the community.

The Conservation Area Appraisal refers to a corn mill present in Combs in the 15th century, which was subsequently used as a mill for cotton, lace and bandages.

This assessment refers only to the census 2011 output area* which covers (as close as possible) the area of Chapel-en-le-Frith which includes Combs and is located within the National Park.

Combs is located within the valley pastures with industry character area of the South West Peak (LSAP 2009).

Combs Village Hall Trust (CVHT) improved the energy efficiency credentials of the village hall and chapel (linked). CVHT installed 3 air-to-air source heat pumps, a large hot water tank, solar hot water panels and improved the roof insulation in the chapel. The improvements cut the electricity use in half and the experience and lessons learnt enabled CVHT to advise others on how to make older buildings more energy efficient.






The parish of Combs has a population of 246 residents (2011 census).





Occupancy of Properties





Car/ Van Ownership








