

Froggatt Parish Statement (draft)



Froggatt is a small close knit settlement which lies north of Calver and Curbar, east of the River Derwent and the A6001 road. It is thought that due to the number of natural springs at Froggatt, it was a natural stopping place on route to Sheffield and Chesterfield. The Conservation Area was designated in 1998 and refers to Froggatt being an agricultural hamlet with earliest known records going back to 1225. Following the building of the bridge over the River Derwent in the 17th century, Froggatt grew to become a settlement rather than remaining as a hamlet.

Froggatt is located within the valley farms with villages and slopes and valleys with woodland of the Derwent Valley area as described within the Peak District Landscape Characteristic Assessment (LSAP 2009).

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




Population and Demographics


Population Age Range

Working and Non Working Adult Population (18+ years)







Housing Tenure





Occupancy of Properties






