The census 2011 assesses Chatsworth and Beeley parishes together. This statement follows that lead for the purposes of data presentation.

Chatsworth parish is effectively the Chatsworth estate, a Grade 1 listed building, formal gardens and parkland home to the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire. It is popular tourist destination in the Peak District and holds a number of national events throughout the year.

Beeley is a tight knit estate village which lies to the south of the Chatsworth Estate, east of the B6012 and was first mentioned in the Domesday book (1086AD). The Conservation Area was designated in 1988. The Conservation Area Appraisal refers to Beeley as a gritstone settlement where agriculture and small scale industries like lead smelting and stone quarrying have helped to shape the layout and character of Beeley. There is a wealth of evidence of Late Neolithic and Bronze Age (c2000-1000 BC) archaeology on the eastern moors close to Beeley and some flint dating back to the Mesolithic period (c4000BC); however the actual origins of Beeley as a settlement are unknown.


Beeley is located within the valley farms with villages of the Derwent Valley area as described within the Peak District Landscape Characteristic Assessment (LSAP 2009).


## Population and Demographics








