

The parish of Heathylee is located in the South West Peak area of the Peak District National Park. The A53 runs through the parish providing good access to Leek, approximately 3 miles, to the southwest and Buxton, approximately 4 miles, to the northeast. Heathylee parish has no specific service centre but is adjacent to the parishes of Longnor and Leekfrith which do.




Population and Demographics



Over the last 5 years, 20 planning applications have been approved in the parish


