


The parish of Waterhouses also includes the settlements of Waterfall, Calton and Cauldon. This assessment includes census data relating to areas that lie outside of the Peak Photo needed here District National Park including part of Waterhouses, the settlement of Cauldon, and all properties which fall within the parish of Waterhouses but outside the Peak District National Park boundary. Waterhouses is a settlement located at the southwest edge of the Peak District National Park between Leek and Ashbourne. Part of Waterhouses settlement, to the northeast of the A523, east of Waterfall Lane and north of Cross Lane is located within the Peak District National Park. It is located in the White Peak, on the riverside meadows of the River Hamps, a tributary of the River Manifold (LSAP 2009), and is popular with walkers accessing the Manifold Trail. Waterfall is less than 1/2 mile north of Waterhouses. It is a small farming settlement with church, public house and village hall. Waterfall Conservation Area was designated in 1997. The settlement is located on upland pastures in the South West Peak character area (LSAP 2009). Calton is a small linear settlement consisting of few houses and farms. It's medieval strip field system is still evident and contribute significantly to the open character of the settlement. Its Conservation Area was designated in 1997. Calton is located within the limestone village farmlands character type of the White Peak (LSAP 2009).



#### Waterhouses and its Services 1 of 2 (national park boundary shown by blue line)







# Waterfall and its Services (national park boundary shown by blue line)




