



Sheldon is a small, linear, agricultural village situated 1 mile SW of Ashford and 3 miles from Bakewell. At over 300 metres high on the limestone plateau, it is set in an upland, windswept White Peak landscape (described in the Peak District Landscape Characteristic Assessment LSAP 2009). Sheldon is mentioned as a settlement in the Doomsday Book, and it has a history of lead mining continuing into the twentieth century with Magpie Mine close by. Due to its special qualities, it was designated as a conservation area in 1995.

It has a population of less than 100 people, with the main social centres being the village hall, church, playing fields (with children's playground, picnic, wildflower and woodland areas) and the public house.

To retain and maintain the special qualities of the area which make it a designated conservation area within the Peak District National Park.











Population and Demographics




It is noted that there are approx. 50 holiday let beds in the village.





Employment


Occupation of working residents*

There are no plans to build affordable housing in the parish at present.








Sheldon Parish Statement (Draft)
