
Hedgerow species suitable for planting in the Peak District

The following tree and shrub species are locally native to the White Peak and Dark Peak and may be appropriate for planting in Peak District hedgerows.

White Peak

Hawthorn (*Crataegus monogyna*)
Blackthorn (*Prunus spinosa*)
Hazel (*Corylus avellana*)
Holly (*Ilex aquifolium*)
Field maple (*Acer campestre*)
Dog rose (*Rosa canina*)
Guelder rose (*Viburnum opulus*)
Dogwood (*Cornus sanguinea*)
Bird Cherry (*Prunus padus*)
Sallows (*Salix caprea* or *cinerea*)
Crab Apple (*Malus sylvestris*)
Wych Elm (*Ulmus glabra*)

Dark Peak

Hawthorn (*Crataegus monogyna*)
Blackthorn (*Prunus spinosa*)
Hazel (*Corylus avellana*)
Holly (*Ilex aquifolium*)
Field maple (*Acer campestre*)
Dog rose (*Rosa canina*)
Guelder rose (*Viburnum opulus*)

Sallows (*Salix caprea* or *cinerea*)

Oak, Ash, Alder, Rowan and English Elm are appropriate hedgerow tree species, dependent on the site.
