The parish of Pott Shrigley is located less than a mile north of Bollington and approximately 2.5 miles west of Kettleshulme. The western part of the parish is located outside the National Park. Pott Shrigley is a small settlement centred around a junction where Shrigley Road meets Bakestonedale Road.

The parish of Pott Shrigley is characterised by slopes and valleys with woodland located within the South West Peak landscape area (Landscape Strategy Action Plan 2009).

To retain the parish as an identifiable community with its own amenities and organisations.


To retain and maintain the village and conservation area with the features which define it as a conservation area.





Tourism Facilities

Being located on the edge of the Park, Pott Shrigley doesn't see a significant impact from tourists other than through traffic travelling into the Park. Pott Shrigley does have hotel facilities but doesn't have any caravanning facilities. A route through the village has recently become a very popular cycle route, (the Brickworks climb), during recent years fine weekend weather during spring and summer means large numbers of cyclist pass through the village.


Planning

Affordable Housing


There are no plans to build affordable housing in the parish at present.
