## **DRAFT ORDER**

## PEAK DISTRICT NATIONAL PARK AUTHORITY (THE ROYCH PROHIBITION OF MECHANICALLY PROPELLED VEHICLES) TRAFFIC REGULATION ORDER 2012

## **ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 (as amended)**

The Peak District National Park Authority ("the Authority") in exercise of its powers under s.22BB (2)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Highway Authorities for the route hereby makes the following Order:

- 1. When used in this Order "road" means any length of highway or any other road to which the public has access and includes footpaths, bridleways, byways open to all traffic and unclassified highways.
- 2. Save as provided in article 4 of this Order no person shall cause or permit any mechanically propelled vehicle to proceed along the route specified in article 3 at any time after the date on which this Order comes into operation.

## 3. THE ROYCH

The unclassified road known as The Roych Clough track in the County of Derbyshire commences at its junction with Sheffield Road (Grid reference SK093825) and proceeds in a generally north-westerly direction for 2 kilometres before turning north and dropping steeply into Roych Clough. From here the track climbs out of the clough for 250 metres, turning in a south-westerly direction, then proceeding in a north-westerly direction for a further 1.25 kilometres to the Hayfield Parish boundary at South Head (Grid reference SK063847) where it becomes a Public Bridleway.

- 4. Nothing in article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any mechanically propelled vehicle to proceed along the route specified in article 3 if the vehicle is being used:
  - a) by emergency services or by any local authority or water company in pursuance of their statutory powers and duties
  - b) use to enable work to be carried out in, on, under or adjacent to the road
  - c) for the purposes of agriculture or land management on any land or premises adjacent to that road
  - d) as a recognised invalid carriage as defined in the Use of Invalid Carriages on Highways Regulations 1988
  - e) upon the direction of or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform
  - f) with the prior written permission of the Authority
- 5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation from any restriction or requirement imposed by any Order or regulations made or having effect as if made under the Act or by or under any other enactment.
- 6. This Order comes into effect on......and may be cited as the Peak District National Park Authority (The Roych Prohibition of Mechanically Propelled Vehicles) Traffic Regulation Order 2012.
