The parish of Lyme Handley is located at the northern tip of the South West Peak, adjacent to the parishes of Pott Shrigley and Kettleshulme. A large part of the parish is Lyme Park, a National Trust owned Grade 1 listed house, gardens and parkland; and the remaining area is agricultural with scattered farmsteads. The western part of the parish is located outside the National Park.










