Roughly half of Dunford parish sits within the National Park, the remainder is within Barnsley Council administrative area. For the purposes of this assessment parish census data has been used.

Within the parish of Dunford is Dunford Bridge, a small settlement, located at the north east edge of the Peak District National Park and consists of one residential cul-de-sac and a few detached properties spread out along Windle Edge road. It is a main access point to the Trans Pennine Trail and so attracts many tourists for which there is a large car park and public transport provision. Just above the settlement to the west is Winscar Reservoir, another popular destination for walkers and water sports.


Dunford straddles two landscape character areas within the Dark Peak; the slopes and valleys with woodland and the moorland slopes & cloughs (LSAP 2009).







Occupancy of Properties




Employment


