

Coombs Dale

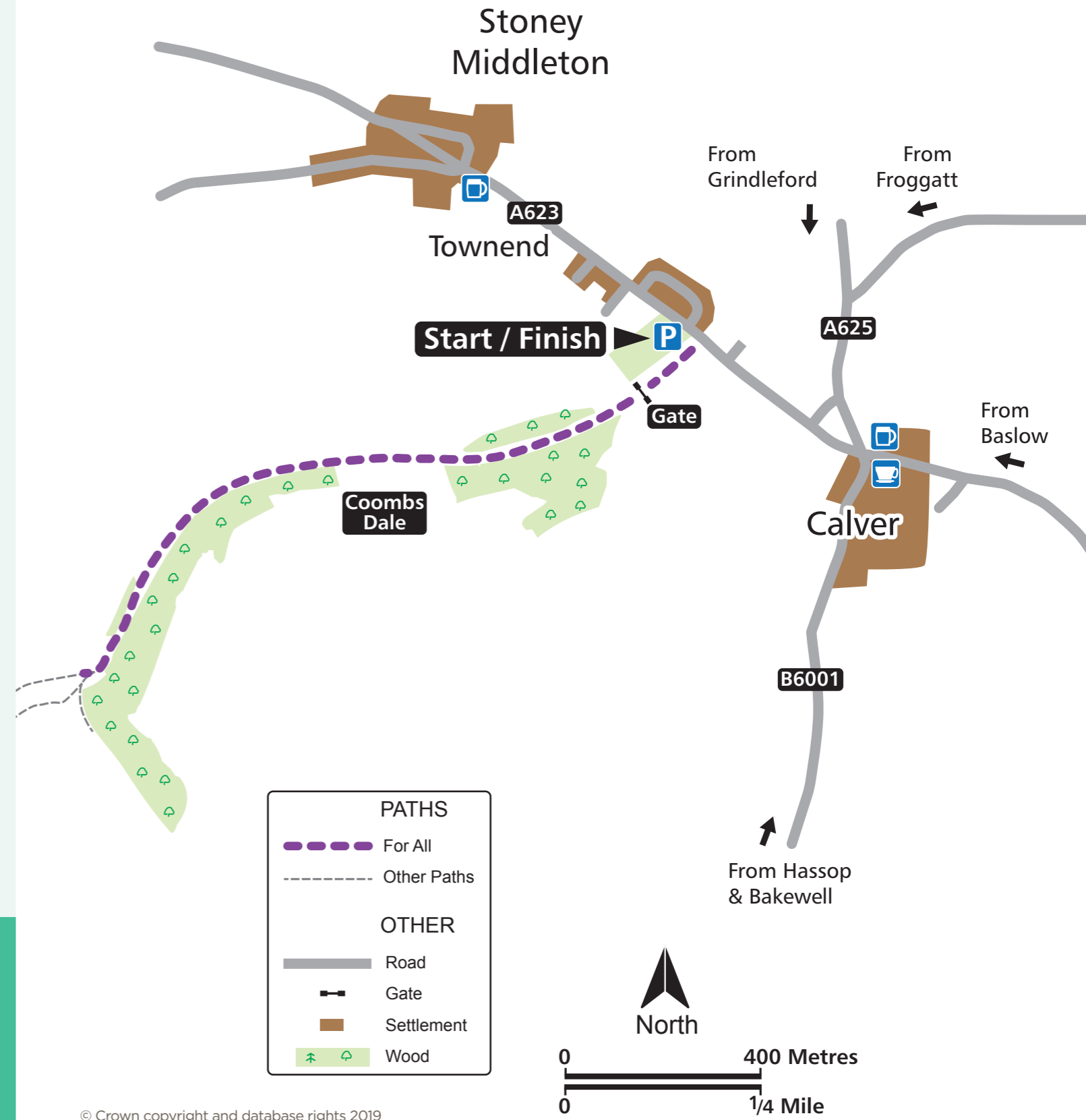


Discover a world apart in an area once roamed by highwaymen. Part of the Black Harry Trails.

Access For All Route:

- ① Head up the track next to the playing fields.
- ② Continue up the dale to where, after a short climb, it opens out with seating.

- i** In the early 18th century, travellers crossing the lonely moors were attacked and robbed by a highwayman who took the name of Black Harry.
- i** The first blossom of the year can be seen in the blackthorn which lines the route.
- i** The limestone is rich in fossils deposited 330 million years ago in shallow, tropical seas when the Peak District was close to the Equator.
