

Alstonefield settlement sits west of the A515 Buxton to Ashbourne road, approximately 4 miles south of Hartington and 7.4 miles north west of Ashbourne.

Alstonefield Conservation Area was designated in 1979 and covers the core area of the settlement. There is no Conservation Area appraisal as yet. The focal point to Alstonefield is around a village green area and The George Inn. Farming has been the main occupation in the area and there is evidence of lynchets (terracing of hillsides for farming) from Saxon times. The area was also mined for lead, which is evident from aptly named 'the Rakes' to the north of the main settlement.

The settlement of Milldale is located less than a mile, southeast of Alstonefield. It has approximately a dozen properties (a mix of residents and holiday accommodation) and is a popular base for walkers, with good access to the Dovedale valley. There is a public carpark, National Trust information barn, toilets and a sandwich shop. Milldale Conservation Area was designated 1993.

Hope and Hopedale are two small adjoining farming settlements located to the southwest of Alstonefield, within Alstonefield parish area.


Stanshope is a small farming community of 4 farms located just under 1 mile, south of Alstonefield.

Alstonefield, Hope, Hopedale and Stanshope are located in an area of limestone village farmlands within the White Peak, described as 'A small-scale settled agricultural landscape characterised by limestone villages, set within a repeating pattern of narrow strip fields bounded by drystone walls.' Mildale is located within the limestone dales of the White Peak (Peak District Landscape Characteristic Assessment (LSAP 2009).


Population and Demographics










Stanshope and its Services
